Mission on Cancer

Challenges

- **2.7 million people** in the EU are **diagnosed** each year
- 1.3 million people die from cancer each year (this no. will increase)
- Total cost of cancer in Europe in 2018: €199 billion
- Impact of COVID-19 pandemic and war in Ukraine



Improve the lives of more than 3 million people by 2030, through prevention, cure and for those affected by cancer including their families, to live longer and better, jointly with the Europe's Beating Cancer Plan

Four Mission objectives

- 1. Understanding cancer
- 2. Prevention & early detection
- 3. Diagnosis and treatment
- 4. Quality of life
- 18 R&I priority areas, 4 transversal R&I priorities: equity, innovation, childhood cancer and personalised medicine
- EUR 378.2 million 2021-2023
- Governance



Concrete actions

- Blueprint for UNCAN.eu platform (started 2022)
- Blueprint for Cancer Patient Digital Centre (2023)
- Support Network of Comprehensive Cancer Infrastructures (2022 2023)
- R&I actions under each of the four mission objectives (2022 2023)
- Synergies (= cooperation between cancer mission and other initiatives at EU, national, regional, local level)

A mission is a portfolio of actions across disciplines intended to achieve a **bold**, **inspirational and measurable goal** within a set timeframe, with **impact** for society and policy making as well as relevance for a significant part of the European population and wide range of European citizens.





Cancer Mission – EU level governance

- Dialogue with Member States: a <u>sub-group on cancer under the Steering Group on Health Promotion and Disease Prevention (SGPP)</u> follows jointly the implementation of the Cancer Plan and the Cancer Mission. Health & Research Ministries
- **Dialogue with stakeholders:** a <u>Stakeholder Contact Group</u> under the EU Health Policy Platform as a basis for discussion and exchanges with stakeholders.
- EU Implementation Group: a dedicated group gathering different Commission services to ensure that actions, policies and findings are aligned across the relevant Commission departments.





Governance – EU and Member States' led initiatives



National Cancer Mission Hubs (permanent structure set up by EU)

National Cancer Hubs to be set up in every MS and some AC to support the mission's implementation



TRAMI (temporary facilitator)

Core network for all 5 missions (ministries, agencies, experts)





National Cancer Mission Hubs

Main activities:

- Awareness raising and coordination of Mission's activities among relevant actors in national, regional or local R&I and health systems;
- Facilitate integration of Mission activities at national, regional, and local levels;
- Facilitate engagement of actors and stakeholders beyond R&I and health systems to cover all areas relevant for cancer control, e.g. cross-policy dialogues;
- Support citizen engagement activities.



Mission – examples of synergies in progress

HE Widening, MSCA, Erasmus+ programmes => address inequalities, promote clustering of projects to achieve portfolio of actions under the cancer mission

HE Health Cluster => support R&I priorities on quality of life and decision support

HE European Innovation Council => support innovation in cancer via SMEs (TRL 6-8)

DIGITAL EUROPE => Federated European infrastructure for cancer images data

EURATOM => clinical efficiency and clinical effectiveness radiotherapy
